REV. KEN HOBBS

Ken is a retired school teacher and a Non Stipendary Minister.

He taught geography as a Senior Teacher for 36 years in four schools on two continents including 4 years in a remote corner of Zambia. For more than 20 years he taught at Glyn School Epsom where he had a senior role as

Head of the Faculty of Humanities. He is passionate about Africa and taught it extensively in his professional career.

He has travelled to many parts of the world including Uganda where he was teaching at a clergy conference for the Diocese of Kampala and Malawi with Hope for Malawi. He has considerable experience of Cross cultural mission.

A graduate of the University of Sussex, he has a Diploma from All Nations Christian College and a PGCE from the University of London. He trained for the Anglican ministry at North Thames Ministerial Training Course based at Oak Hill College and holds an Advanced Diploma in Pastoral and Theological Studies from Middlesex University. He was ordained in 1998 and his ordained ministry has included 10 years as the part time Vicar of Albury near Guildford where he witnessed substantial church growth. His Grove Book "Growing Churches through House for Duty Ministry" tells this story. He returned "home" to St Paul's Howell Hill in 2011.

He has a lifetime's experience of working with children, families and young people and uses his teaching skills and experience to make the Bible come alive.

He is married to Margaret (also a teacher) and they have two married children and 4 grandchildren.

He is currently pastoral minister at St Paul's offering two days a week in coordinating the pastoral ministry of the church including Mid Week Focus, Hendford Nursing Home and the work of the three Pastoral Assistants. He has an extensive funeral ministry with local funeral directors to families who may have little or no church connection but would like a Christian Minister to take the service. Holding a "Permission to Officiate Licence from the Bishop, he has often been away from St Paul's on Sundays preaching at other churches in the

Deanery and beyond. That will now change as St John's becomes his priority!

His interests are eating, golf, gardening, travel, cycling and Norwich City Football Club.

Rev. Ken Hobbs will be joining St John's from 1st October and we hope that you will all meet with him in due course.

REV. HAYDON WILCOX - PILGRIMAGE

Every year The Revd. Haydon Wilcox leads a holiday/pilgrimage to Iona in Scotland. This is the island where St. Columba founded his monastic order and took Christianity to Scotland and parts of northern England.

Staying at Bishop's House, the Anglican Retreat House, there is the opportunity to join in the worship of the Iona Community at the famous Abbey. We have days out to Staffa to see Fingal's Cave; wildlife exploring on the Island of Mull and walking the pilgrim's path on Iona. There's the village dance to attend, the sea to swim in, beautiful beaches to chill out on, lots of craft shops to explore and many times to be still and relax. A rhythm of worship is offered but not mandatory, in Bishop's House and at the Abbey. The place is filled with history, beauty and treats like cream teas! There is a great sense of safety travelling with a party, knowing that everything is organised, whilst having the freedom to do one's own thing. People often travel with their partner, who may not be particularly religious. No pressure is put upon anyone and people of no faith are encouraged to pursue their interests like walking, photography,

drawing and bird watching. Bishop's House offers an inclusive package and the accommodation is homely and welcoming. The food is excellent, with special needs catered for.

OUR REGULAR SERVICES AT ST JOHN'S

Sundays at 8.30am:

Holy Communion – a 'said' service held in the side Lady Chapel using Common Worship.

Sundays at 10.00am:

1st Sunday of the month: Worship Together – a family friendly service sometimes including Holy Communion.

Followed by refreshments.

Other Sundays at 10.00am: Holy Communion – a service with hymns and a sermon followed by refreshments. Each week there is a dedicated family area in church for very young children and in term time there is a children's group in the Parish Centre.

MIDWEEK SERVICES

Tuesdays at 9.15am:

Morning Prayer using Celtic liturgy, including prayer together and times of silence. Held in the Lady Chapel for around 20 minutes.

Wednesdays at 10.00am:

Holy Communion – a reflective service using the Book of Common Prayer held in the lady chapel. Refreshments are served afterwards with a time for conversation.

Thursdays at 6.00 pm:

Evening Prayer using Celtic liturgy, including prayer together and times of silence-held in the Lady Chapel for approximately 20 minutes.

Please speak to those administering communion if you would like to receive either a gluten free wafer or non-alcoholic wine.

At any of our Communion services, if you would like to receive Communion but find walking difficult, please speak to a Welcomer at the door and they will arrange for Communion to be brought to you in your seat.
