To ensure we follow all guide lines and protocols for managing the risk of COVID-19 in places of worship, we have:-

- carried out full COVID-19 risk assessments.
- have cleaning, hand cleaning/sanitisation and hygiene procedures in place.
- Have taken all reasonable steps to help everyone maintain a 2m distance between different users of the Church.

We are asking those of you that do attend St John's to :-

- Refrain from entering if you are feeling unwell or have experienced any COVID-19 symptoms in the past seven days
- Take responsibility for your own safety and that of your household and other people by maintaining social distancing.

The King's Storeroom

The King's Storeroom is a small Christian Bookshop in the URC church in Kingston. It is open normal hours 10-4 Monday to Fridays and 10-2 Saturdays.

FOODBANK

The start of the long summer holidays means that the Foodbank is experiencing an increase in demand. As they've done in previous years, they will be supporting families who would normally benefit from free school meals. They could use some 'child friendly' food now. Whilst they aim to provide a nutritious food package it also nice to include snacks and treats.

It is not only children who like a sweet treat as many of their elderly clients ask for biscuits and chocolate. One has a particular liking for 'Jamie Dodgers'.

Another thing worth mentioning is that if donating things like ketchup both small and large bottles would be appreciated. They do cater for many single people in addition to larger family units.

In the last week they fed in excess of 260 people and made over 100 home deliveries.

As previously mentioned, they do have a very good stock of many of the basic items so if possible please donate only the items on the following list -

Biscuits, Children's treats - chocolate etc., Savoury snacks - crisps etc Sugar - small bags if possible, Custard, Long life sponge puddings Cooking sauces, Tinned vegetables including sweetcorn, Ketchup/brown sauce Long life fruit juice, Powdered milk, Peanut butter - URGENT Female deodorant, Shaving foam Nappies - size 5 and above only please Washing powder/tablets/capsules/liquid - URGENT Cleaning products - bleach, anti bac sprays etc
